

Monthly Report – August 2025

Executive Summary:

In August 2025, the Mission of Hope and Mercy continued its commitment to serving vulnerable communities by responding to urgent needs through food assistance and community support. This month's highlight was a significant contribution to the Rosary Sisters' Scout Group summer camp, ensuring 100 children had access to proper nutrition, hygiene, and a nurturing environment. These efforts not only provided material relief but also reinforced our mission of fostering dignity, compassion, and hope

1. Key Activities and Support Provided:

1. Food Assistance and Hygiene supply:

In response to a request from the Rosary Sisters' Scout Group, part of the Cedar Scouts Association, the **Mission of Hope and Mercy** provided over **420 lbs** of essential food and hygiene supplies to support their July summer camp. This donation helped ensure proper nutrition and care for 100 participating children.

Items Delivered:

• Tuna: 116 pcs (38.3 lbs)

• Cream Cheese: 36 pcs (31.7 lbs)

• Hummus: 41 pcs (36.1 lbs)

• Hotdogs: 72 pcs (63.4 lbs)

• Luncheon Meat: 116 pcs (204.2 lbs)

• Ketchup: 1 pc (5.3 lbs)

• Milk: 5 pcs (8.3 lbs)

• Sugar: 4 pcs (7.9 lbs)

• Toilet Paper: 120 rolls (approx. 26.4 lbs)

- Hygiene and Wellbeing: Provision of toilet paper and essential supplies ensured proper sanitary conditions, contributing to the children's safety and dignity.
- Community Empowerment: Strengthening ties with the Rosary Sisters and the Cedar Scouts Association enhanced collaboration and created a model for future youth-focused initiatives.
- Psychosocial Benefit: By relieving families of additional costs, the donation allowed children to fully enjoy camp activities, fostering joy, teamwork, and resilience.

3. Challenges and Areas for Growth:

- Sustainability of Food Assistance: Demand for food aid continues to rise, highlighting the need for longer-term strategies beyond emergency distribution.
- Resource Mobilization: With limited funding and growing requests, expanding donor networks and recurring contributions remain a priority.
